This page provides a brief list of some of the skills and interests needed by public health managers.

Public health managers will have well developed skills in:

- overseeing the processes involved in tendering of services
- preparing and implementing project plans and strategies and their effectiveness
- setting up clear lines of communication between staff and stakeholders
- financial and people management
- identifying and influencing opportunities for policy development that will improve health and wellbeing and reduce inequalities

Public health managers have skills and knowledge primarily at levels 8 and 9 of the Skills for Health Career Framework [1].
