And <u>physiotherapy student</u> [2] Heather Beebe talks about her dyslexia diagnosis and the support she's receiving. <u>Heather</u> [4] says: "It was a talk by the university disability adviser that spurred me on to seek help from the university, because he made it sound as if it was ok to have a problem and that support was available."
