They have a number of responsibilities such as liaising with frontline staff and other professionals, working with the public, managing complaints and looking at how best to deliver key NHS services.

- facilities management [2]
- hotel services management [3]
- decontamination services management [4]
- integrated urgent care/NHS 111 team leader [5]

Operational managers can progress into senior positions at board level such as a director of operations
