

You'll help people live longer and healthier lives through the safe use of medicines and excellent healthcare advice on issues such as sexual health and giving up smoking.


Becoming a pharmacist [1]

You'll work with patients every day and help with their prescriptions. You'll also answer their questions, either face-to-face or over the phone.




Becoming a pharmacy assistant [2]
