



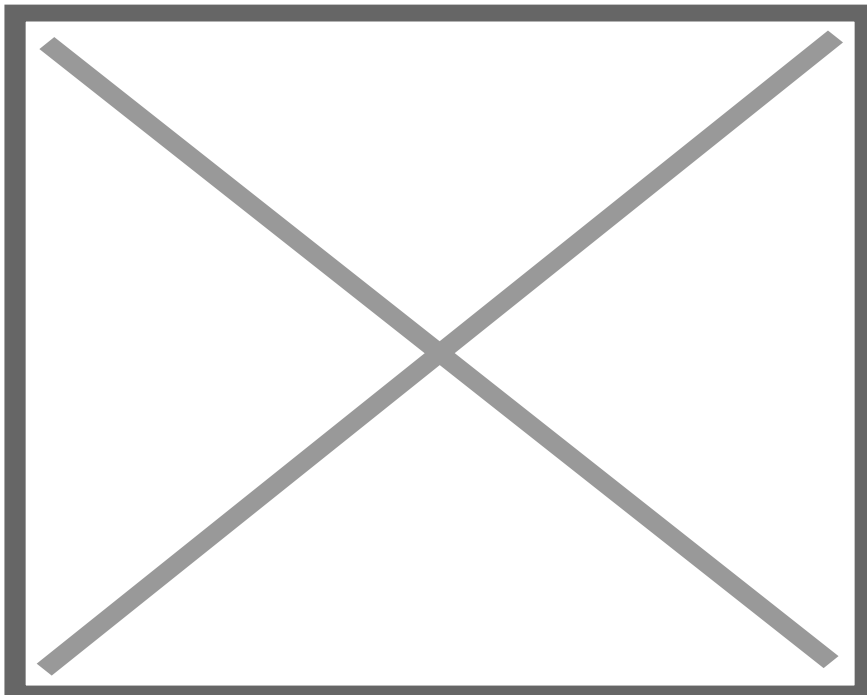
Types of nursing

You'll deliver care and support to patients who are struggling with their mental health, helping them manage their condition with medication or relevant therapies.

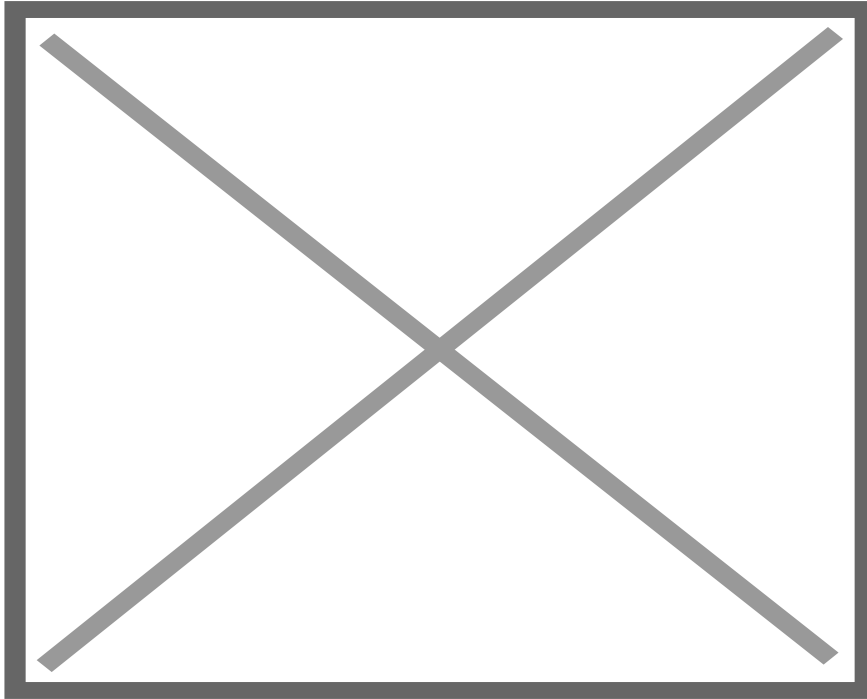

You'll help people with learning disabilities to live an independent and fulfilling life, working alongside a multidisciplinary team as you support patients of all ages.

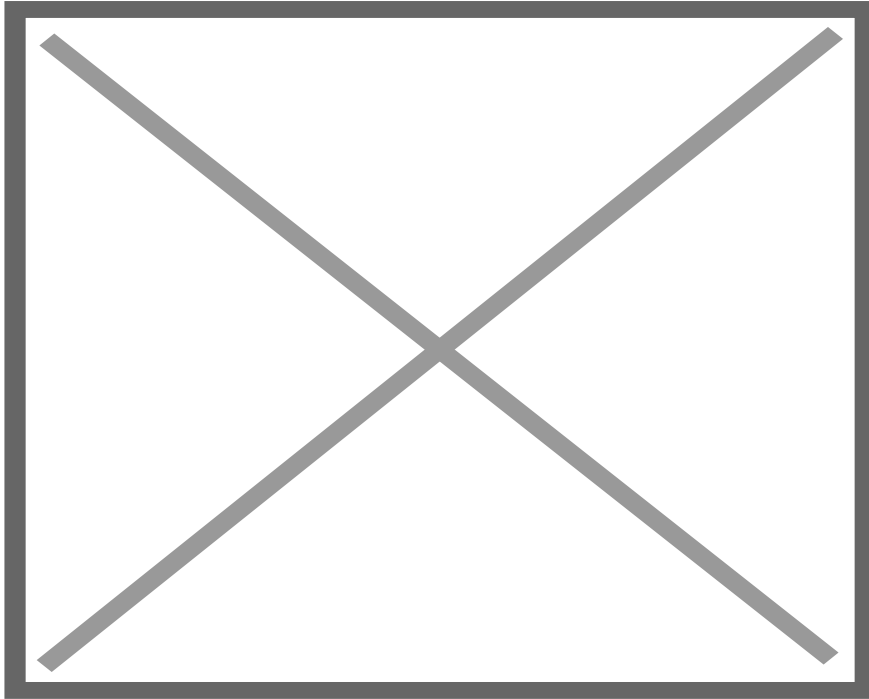
Becoming a learning disability nurse ^[2]

You'll look after adult patients of all ages who suffer from long or short-term physical health conditions, assessing their needs and planning their care as you nurses them back to health.

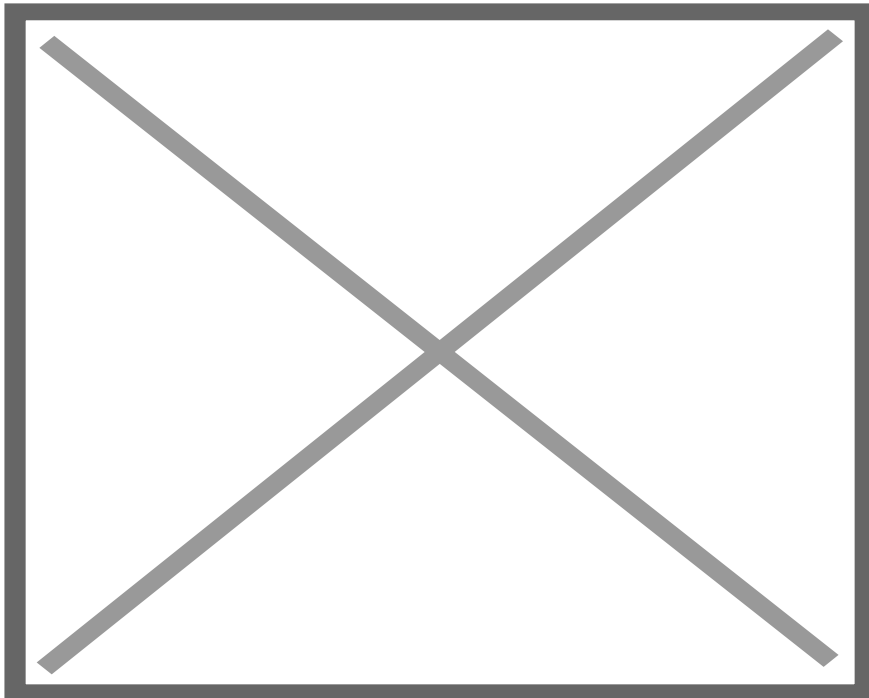
Becoming an adult nurse ^[3]

You'll work with children of all ages, from newborns to adolescents, providing treatment and care to them, and support to their parents or carers.

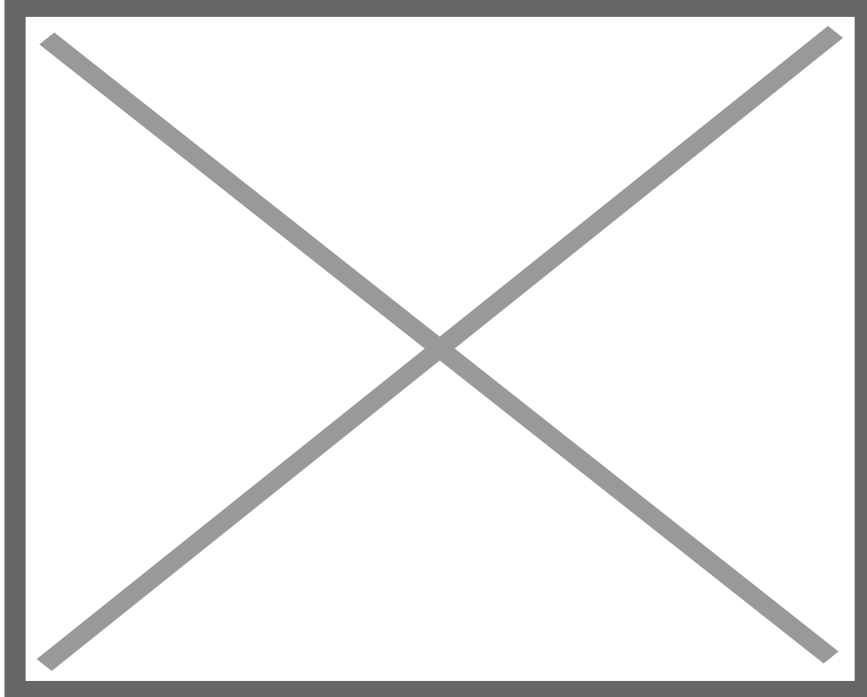
Becoming a children's nurse ^[4]
