How I got into the role

Taking part in the <u>Project Choice supported internship programme</u> [1] led to me getting my administration assistant apprenticeship at Cumbria, Northumberland, Tyne and Wear NHS (CNTWNHS) Foundation Trust. I was so nervous and didn't know what to expect.

I have very limited direction and found communication very difficult but Project Choice gave me the confidence I needed and self-belief to achieve. It helped me develop my communication skills and encourages me to talk to others at work.

I am still doing my Level 2 apprenticeship with CNTWNHS but it's taken a pause due to Covid-19. At present, I work part-time as a business administration assistant for Project Choice at Health Education England on Mondays and Tuesdays.
