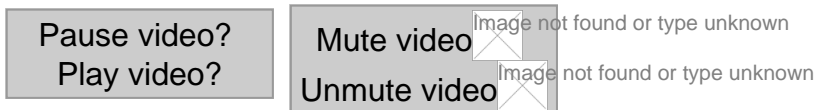


# "I feel like there is a career ahead of me working in the NHS."
