Hours

Under the rules of the European Working Time Directive [1] (EWTD) as a resident doctor you should expect:

- to work on average no more than 48 hours per week
- to have 11 hours' rest per day and the right to a day off each week
- a right to a rest break if the working day is longer than six hours
- 5.6 weeks' paid leave each year

Salary

As a resident doctor you are paid on a national pay scale unless you are informed of any variation to this by your employing NHS Trust. <u>Our pay for doctors page [3]</u> provides more details.

Although your application is made to a Foundation School, you are employed directly by an NHS Trust and you should approach them for further information relating to:

- pay
- banding
- rotas
- accommodation
