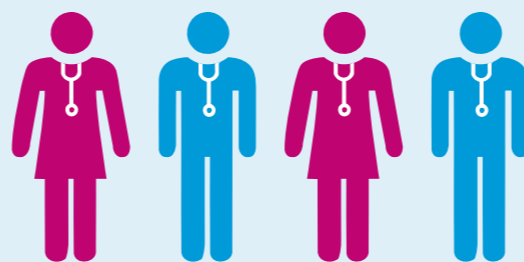
67% of NHS staff aged 16-24 see themselves working in the NHS in 10 years.^[1]
