



Meet Harry

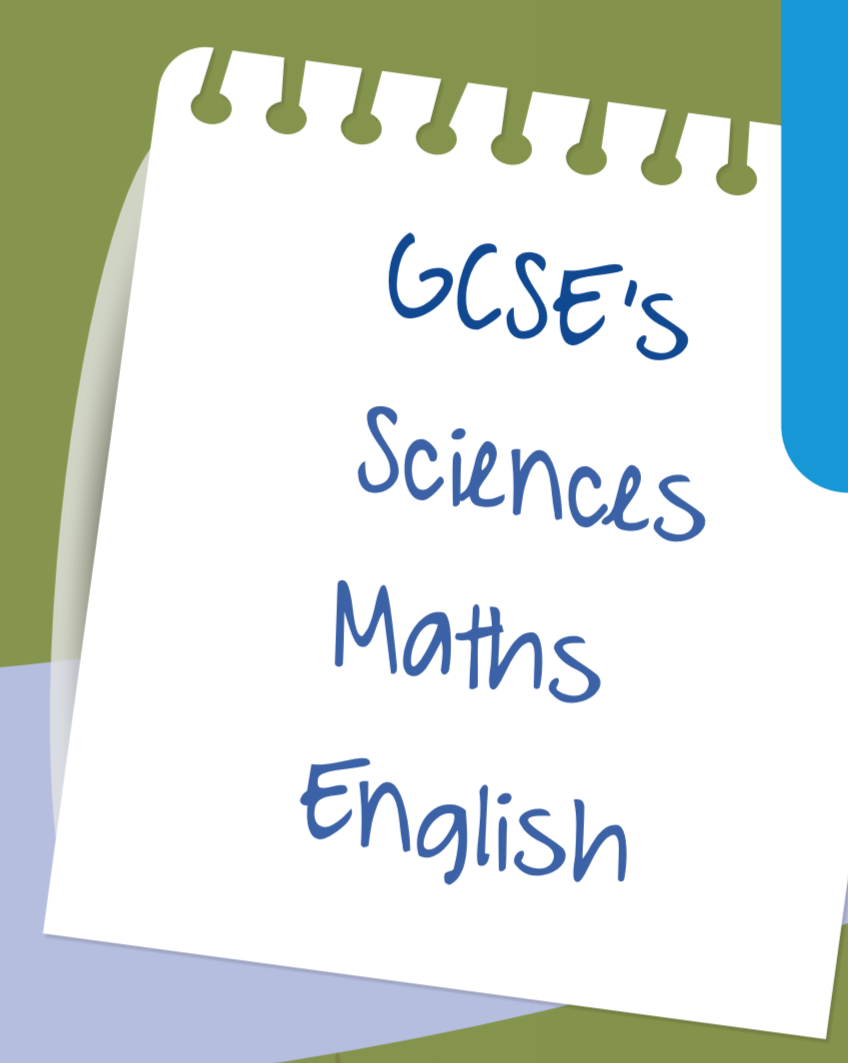
Harry was often asked what he wanted to be when he grew up.
