
Training

Health visitors are registered nurses or midwives, who have taken an approved programme in Specialist Community Public Health Nursing or Health Visiting. [2]



94% of nursing students get a job within six months of finishing their course. [3]





Entry requirements To become a registered nurse or midwife, you'll need to study for a degree level qualification in nursing or midwifery through either a full-time course or a degree apprenticeship. You'll typically need a minimum of five GCSEs at grade 4-9/C or above plus two or three A-levels or equivalent qualifications at level 3. [5]

Entry requirements
