



Note: MRCS has two parts which has to be taken prior to entry to ST3 but can actually be taken any time after graduation from medical school. Further information can be found on [The Intercollegiate Surgical Curriculum](#) on page 265.

Note: As this is a run-through, you do not have to apply for the ST3 post; it is guaranteed as long as you complete ST1 and ST2. MRCS must be taken before going onto ST3.

Note: OMFS trainees must be qualified in both dentistry and medicine and have achieved foundation and core competencies. The order in which these competencies are achieved can vary depending on your preference.

MRCS - Membership of the Royal College of Surgeons
ENT - Ear, Nose and Throat
CT - Core Training
ST - Specialty Training
CCT - Certificate of Completion of Training

Note: As this is a run-through, you do not have to apply for the ST3 post; it is guaranteed as long as you completed ST1 and ST2. To pass or attain MRCS before going onto ST3.
