

Examinations: Entry to ST3 ICM is through competitive national interviews. In addition to completion of one of the identified ICM core training programmes you will need to have completed one of the following exams, as relevant to that core programme.

MCEM - Membership of the College of Emergency Medicine
FFICM - Fellowship Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine
FRCA (Primary) - Fellowship of the Royal College of Anaesthetists

The Single CCT in ICM takes 7 years from CT1 to ST7, as reflected on the above diagram. Dual CCTs training in ICM and one of its partner specialties (currently Acute Medicine, Anaesthetics, Emergency Medicine, Respiratory Medicine and Renal Medicine) extends to around 8.5 years.

Note: You will be required to pass the Final FFICM examination in order to progress to the final year.
